Fire Chief's Message

The City of Napoleon's Fire and Rescue Department (NFD) provides Fire and Emergency Medical Services to the residents of Napoleon as well as portions of Harrison, Freedom, Flatrock and Napoleon Townships. Our total contracted area encompasses approximately 53 square miles and provides service to roughly 11,750 people. Napoleon Fire and Rescue department is a combination department consisting of full-time and part-time employees. All full-time employees are fully trained Paramedics, Firefighters, Fire Inspectors, and Haz-Mat Technicians. Part-time employee training rages from EMT to Paramedic and volunteer fire certification to level 2 firefighter certification. Napoleon Fire and Rescue members are required to maintain these certifications as part of their employment.

Napoleon Fire Department is the only full service Fire and EMS department in Henry County, protecting about 1/3 of the county population. The Department answered 1509 calls for service in 2016 and requested mutual aid response for only eleven (11) of those calls. The Department provided mutual aid and Special Team responses for twenty – seven (27).

The Napoleon Fire Department maintains an Insurance Service Office (ISO) rating of 4. We are the only department in Henry County that holds this rating. The department was re-evaluated this year and there was no change in the rating.

Napoleon Fire Department also provides Hazardous Materials, Water Rescue, and Confined Space, response and control services to Henry County and the surrounding areas. The department is part of a state wide emergency response system that allows us to call on other agencies in the system for assistance as well as provide assistance to those who call for our specialized skills.

There were many changes and upgrades throughout 2016. The Department was a recipient of two automatic CPR devices that were donated by local citizens for an estimated value of \$25,000. The Department was awarded \$239,000 grant for the build of a fire training facility.

Napoleon Fire department will continue to provide superb fire, EMS and rescue services in our region while containing operating costs.

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
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Napoleon Fire & Rescue's organizational chart consist of thirty-seven employees. These employees range from fire chief to firefighter and are either full-time or part-time. Napoleon Fire & Rescue is allotted up to 50 positions within its ranks. Currently 80% of the membership is part-time employees.

Tony Druhot (Assistant Chief) retired from the full-time staff. Tony served on the department for 25 years.

Napoleon Fire & Rescue recruited eight new part-time and three new full-time members in 2016.

There were two promotions in 2016. Joel Frey was promoted from Captain to Assistant Chief. David Bowen was promoted from firefighter to Captain.



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



There were 2150 classes members attended throughout the year. Most training is conducted in house by our own fire and EMS instructors, but there was some outside classes attended by members. Classes from the Ohio Fire Academy, Bowling Green State University, and the Ohio Fire Chiefs Association were some of the classes attended. Classes ranged from basic firefighting to Fire Officer and from EMT to paramedic.

Firefighters, EMTs, and Paramedics require an extensive amount of training every year. Firefighters are required to have 56 hours of continuing education every 3 years. EMT's are required to have 40 hours of continuing education every 3 years and paramedics are required to have 86 hours every 3 years. 75% of the Napoleon Fire & Rescue department is cross trained requiring them to meet the requirements for firefighter as well as their respected EMS certification.

In 2016 the Napoleon Fire and Rescue department focused on training, and future planning.

Training remained the focus during 2016. There were many new hires in 2016, therefore requiring a lot more training for personnel to become familiar with our policies and procedures. The Department held its first new hire training academy when three new hires started.

Future planning included the planning for apparatus changes for 2017. Apparatus upgrades include a command vehicle and utility/brush truck.

The non-emergency transport service was approved and will continue. This service is an assist for the community as well as the department. The department experience many more overlapping calls and was able to provide a quick response because of the extra personnel provided by this service. The department transported 283 patients with this service.

2017 Goals and Objectives

The completion of fire training facility and apparatus replacement will be a priority in 2017.

Napoleon Fire and Rescue will continue to analyze its efficiency within its operations. Napoleon Fire and Rescue is always looking to be more efficient and exposing areas of needed improvement within its operations. Some key points of focus will include utilization of staff, apparatus conditions and replacement, and maximizing our community involvement.

Napoleon Fire & Rescue is committed to giving the citizens of Napoleon what they deserve. Napoleon Fire & Rescue will start with a more identified chain of command. In 2017 Napoleon Fire & Rescue will be civil service testing for the position of full time Captain and testing for part time Lieutenants. Having a clear identified chain of command with permanent officers Napoleon Fire & Rescue can better meet its mission.
